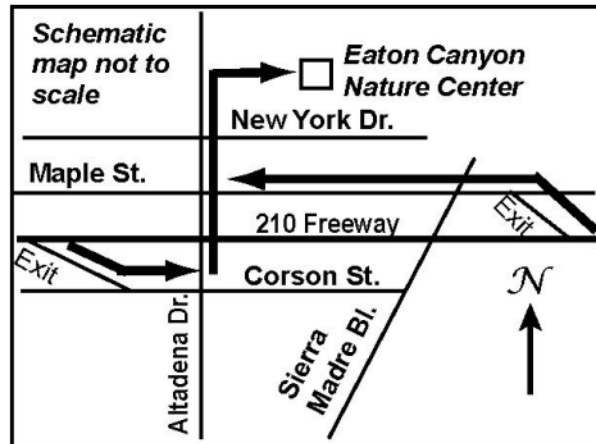
PLANT WALKS

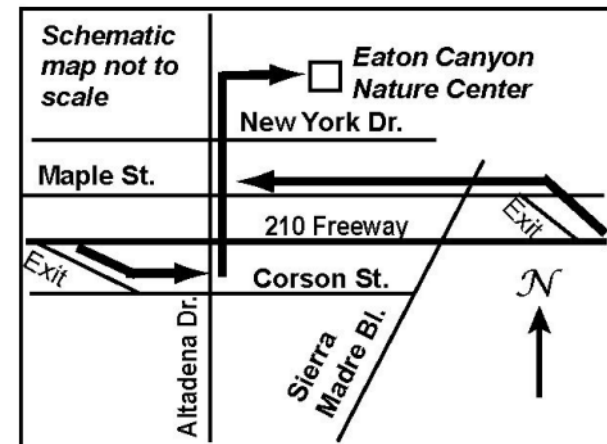
