**T-SHIRT ARTWORK CONTEST
CALL FOR SUBMISSIONS**

The San Gabriel Mountains Chapter of the California Native Plant Society is holding a contest for a new t-shirt design. We are looking for submissions of artwork featuring native plants of the San Gabriel Mountains. The winning design should capture the spirit of our beloved mountain biomes. Submissions are due by January 10, 2021. The winning artwork will be printed on our chapter t-shirt, and the winning artist will receive a prize of \$500. The winner will be announced on January February 1, 2021.

The winner and two runners-up will receive one-year memberships in the California Native Plant Society (if not already a member). The first 20 artists to submit will receive a copy of [Wild Suburbia: Learning to Garden with Native Plants](#) by chapter board member Barbara Eisenstein.

Artwork guidelines:

The artwork must feature at least one native plant species that occurs in the San Gabriel Mountains. For inspiration, we've compiled a list of suggestions of plants from the San Gabriel Mountains that we love (scroll to the bottom for list & links). The design is not required to contain any of the species on the list.

The artist should incorporate the words "California Native Plant Society San Gabriel Mountains Chapter" into the design.

The art should be an original work created by the person who is submitting it.

There are no limitations on colors or technique — the printing method will be chosen based on the winning design.

The final design will be printed at maximum dimensions of 10" x 12" (see the diagram below) — however, the artwork can be smaller than 10" x 12". The artwork is to be submitted as a computer file, sized to print at 300 DPI, or be a vector image. Accepted file types are PDF, PSD, AI, PNG, and TIFF (JPGs are accepted but not preferred).



How to submit:

Send artwork to info@cnps-sgm.org no later than January 10, 2021. Please include the artist's name and a brief description of the artwork. If the file is too large to attach to email, it can be sent using a free service such as [WeTransfer](#).

Image usage:

By submitting artwork to this contest, you grant CNPS San Gabriel Mountains Chapter permission to share the image through email, website and social media, unless you request otherwise. The winning artwork will be printed on t-shirts that will be sold by the chapter.
